Comedy Night Cancelled for 2020

With the cancellation of the fair, the Chamber of Commerce and the County have cancelled all bookings in 2020 at the Regional Center. They are anxious to confirm our date for 2021. We have arranged with the agent for Rik Roberts, our comedy act, to postpone his appearance with the date open and to be confirmed later.

The committee is interested in meeting to discuss other options and alternate venues, possibly for the fall, but until the rules for public gather-

ings are announced with some certainty, we will only be able to consider them as possibilities.

We have received just over \$12,000 in payments so far. It has been suggested that many of those who bought tables and or tickets might be willing to consider the payments as donations, rather than request refunds. We are looking into the availability of donation receipts to be issued by the founda-

tion under IRS 501c3.

It was suggested recently at a board meeting that the club should consider dates other that the Saturday before Mother's Day for Comedy night. Now is the time to thrash this out and book our 2021 date. There are several other weekends in the spring with conflicts such as Mustang Madness and other competing fundraisers. If you have suggestions or know of conflict dates, share them now, so we can book next vear.
